

We introduced how we are addressing explicit teaching of effective emotional regulation and developing the use of shared language and terminology schoolwide. The meeting outlined how the 'Zones of Regulation' is a curriculum that is aimed at helping children gain skills to consciously regulate their actions as this leads to increased self-control and their ability to problem solve. I have received plenty of positive feedback from those who attended and we plan on holding a second parent information evening later in the year. If you missed the hui, I have emailed a PDF copy of the presentation and the parent information leaflet to you.

This term our ongoing fundraiser has been 'Ice block Friday' which has been a huge success. So far this has raised over \$1500 and the money raised will go towards additional science resources on the teachers 'wish list.' Thank you for supporting this and thank you to Dee Hattaway and Sharon Hartley for organising the ice blocks each week. Next Friday (12th April) will be the last week for ice blocks.

Empowering Healthier Futures Through "Food for Thought"

The Year 6/7/8 students recently had Andy from Food for Thought visit the school to deliver three nutrition sessions to the students.

The first two sessions saw students learn about how foods and nutrients support active and growing bodies. We also learnt how to read the nutritional information on packaged foods and explored the sugar content in different drinks. We discovered that a 600ml bottle of Coca-Cola contains a staggering 16 teaspoons of sugar!

In the third session, students were given the opportunity to apply their newfound knowledge in a real-world setting. We visited Silverdale Pak n Save where students analysed nutrition labels on various packaged foods to learn more about what is in our foods. The year students are now expert food detectives! Don't hesitate to ask them to showcase their new skills to you.

We are grateful to all our adult helpers for their support at the supermarket. At the end of the programme, each class received a \$60 Pack n Save gift card to share some healthy kai. It was great to have the Food for Thought team with us to give our students important lessons they can carry with them through life.
