Waitoki School (1558) Enrolment Scheme

1 February 2020

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone <u>described below</u> shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at 361 Waitoki Road (Addresses 361, 342 and below included). Head along Waitoki Road toward Kahikatea Flat Road. Then turn left onto Kahikatea Flat Road (309 – 1405, 350 – 1458 included, Rapson Road and Dye Access Road included). Continue east along Kahikatea Flat Road then turn right onto Forestry Road (both sides included, Horseshoe Bush addresses 606, 609 and above included, Ireland Road included) towards Bald Hill Road. Turn right onto Bald Hill Road and continue along it towards Ararimu Valley. Follow Ararimu Valley Road (odd addresses not included) south towards Barlow Road and then onto Anzac Road. From Anzac Road travel east along it and then turn right onto Spinlay Road. Continue along Spinlay Road and then turn left onto Blackbridge Road (488 and above included) travelling northwest along it and Bald Hill Road back to Forestry Road. Travel north along Forestry Road and then turn left onto Kahikatea Flat Road and continue north west along it before turning right onto Waitoki Road. Continue along Waitoki Road until reaching the start point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how

applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority This priority category is not applicable at this school because the

school does not run a Special programme approved by the

Secretary.

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of

the school.

Fifth Priority will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee

of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the


school.

<u>Sixth Priority</u> will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
